Advancing Excellence

In 2018, the <u>Ohio Child Welfare Training</u>

<u>Program (OCWTP)</u> met federal standards for quality, as determined by the <u>Child and Family Services Review (CFSR)</u>.

OCWTP also made an impact in the following areas:

Casework Practice

We improved Ohio's assessment and case-planning outcomes by

- Expanding training of the Comprehensive Assessment and Planning Model (CAPMIS) for practitioners, support staff, and OCWTP trainers
- Tracking CAPMIS training effectiveness to ensure ongoing quality and improvement of the model
- Supporting long-term retention after CAPMIS training through follow-up learning prompts and coaching

Founded in 1986, the <u>Ohio Child Welfare Training Program (OCWTP)</u> is a comprehensive, <u>competency-based</u> in-service training system that promotes learning excellence for child welfare staff and caregivers.

Foster Care Practice

We enhanced best practice in foster caregivers by

- Creating a new systematic way to collect individual training needs assessment (ITNA) data for foster caregivers
- Using ITNA data to offer learning activities or develop new ones to meet those needs
- Increasing foster caregiver skills and stabilizing placements through individualized coaching

Substance Abuse Training

We enhanced behavioral health outcomes for families by

- Providing more opportunities for trainees to learn directly from behavioral health professionals
- Training staff and caregivers across the state on the standardized curriculum Supporting Families with Substance Use, Mental, and Co-Occurring Disorders
- Adapting the workshop <u>Understanding Birth Parent Addiction and the Impact</u> on the <u>Children in Your Home</u> to a live distance learning format to reach more caregivers

Learning Science Application


We continued our work to advance and amplify learning by

- Helping trainers implement retention strategies before, during, and after training
- Developing tools such as post training prompts to help learners get the most out of training
- Automating delivery of post-training exercises to keep learning fresh for real-world applications

The OCWTP is a collaborative effort of the <u>Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS)</u>, the <u>Public Children Services Association of Ohio (PCSAO)</u>, <u>eight Regional Training Centers (RTCs)</u> throughout Ohio, and the <u>Institute for Human Services (IHS)</u>.

559 Coaching Hours Delivered for Staff, Caregivers, and Executives

4.510 Hours of Distance Learning Provided, Including:

- **4,440** Hours of Self-Directed Training: Participants complete these on-demand, interactive courses on their own, anytime from anywhere via internet access.
 - 9 Hours of Blended Learning: Self-directed and virtual classroom training are combined to allow for increased skill-building, reflection, retention, and application.
- Hours of Virtual Classroom Training:
 Participants meet as a group live
 online with a trainer for an engaging
 and interactive learning experience.
 - 1 Webinar to 72 Participants: Short online sessions are designed to connect larger audiences with subject matter experts in high-need topic areas.
