Clinical Supervision of CAPMIS - Training Series

This series is designed to provide supervisors with **ready-to-use** tools and strategies to monitor and improve the quality of completed CAPMIS tools. The series includes the following workshops:

- *Tools for Supervisors - Using Unit Peer Review to Increase Quality and Timeliness of Safety Assessment*
- *Tools for Supervisors - Making the Link between Child Vulnerability and Protective Capacities Using Critical Thinking Exercises*
